Course Overview

The Level 3 Qualification in Coaching and Mentoring is designed for supervisors and first-line managers, to support the development of coaching and mentoring skills and techniques of individuals and teams, alongside working to achieve organisational objectives.

Course Requirements

This qualification can be offered to Learners from age 19.

GCSE's Maths and English A-C or an equivalent functional skills qualification at Level 2

Students will be contacted by a course tutor and a formal assessment of the professional will be reviewed.

Applicants will be invited to an information session to learn more about the course and eligibility criteria.

Assessment

The written word, however generated and recorded, is still expected to form the majority of assessable work produced by Learners at Level 3. The amount and volume of work for each unit at this level should be broadly comparable to a word count of 2000- 2500 words. Learner work should aim to minimise the amount of unnecessary attachments or appendices. Information that is essential to the Learners work in order to meet the learning outcomes and assessment criteria should be included within the main body of the report.
